
"A great introduction to a consummate story teller. This book deals with some big issues in a way which is approachable for young children - a tale of deep friendship as well as being a real page turner."



"People expect this to be aimed at younger children but there is a lot of text in this original book and as a classic it is a great introduction. A funny and charming tale beautifully told."



